"Egg-cellent" Choices for Hens

Read.

Did you know one hen can lay almost 260 eggs a year? Hens are most often raised on farms. There are several **humane** ways to take care of hens as they lay eggs.

One kind of hen housing is called an **enriched colony house**. A small flock of hens live together here. They have room to sit and stand. They can turn around and lift their wings. These hens also have a nest box for laying eggs, a scratching area, and perches. These hens have room to be hens!

A second type of housing is called **cage-free**. Hens that live here can move around. They also have perches, nest boxes, and places to peck and scratch. Some cage-free farmers let their hens go outdoors during the day.

A third type of housing is called **free-range**. It is sometimes called a **pasture system** too. Here, hens can go outside during the day. They lay their eggs indoors in nest boxes in the barn where they go at night or if the weather gets bad.
