

Save the Sharks

Sharks—are they scary or supercool? Some people think sharks are scary. They know some big sharks like great whites have rows of sharp, pointy teeth. They know sharks eat meat. Some people think sharks are supercool. They know sharks have been around for hundreds of millions of years. In fact, there were sharks swimming in the oceans when dinosaurs were walking the earth. They also know there are 400 different species, or kinds, of sharks. What else makes sharks supercool? They have amazing senses. Many kinds of sharks can see clearly in the dark parts of the oceans, and most can smell their prey from far away.

Sadly, many species of sharks are threatened with **extinction**. This means there is a chance they will die out. Why? Some sharks grow slowly and do not produce a lot of young. This makes their numbers small to begin with. Now, in some parts of the world, people want to use the fins in their food. As a result, sharks have been **overfished**. This means too many have been caught so there aren't enough remaining. No wonder some sharks are threatened with extinction.

What can you do to help the sharks? Don't support stores that sell shark products. Encourage your family to donate to groups that help sharks or help protect ocean life. Share what you know about sharks with others.
