

I Rise Like the Sun

Math Action Chant: concept of morning, noon, and nighttime

This relaxing little action chant helps build vocabulary. To begin, recite the chant for youngsters without the actions. Then ask, "What does *noon* mean?" Lead youngsters to conclude that *noon* is another word for 12:00 pm. This is a time when many people eat lunch. Next, have students perform the action chant.

I rise with the sun in the morning. (Stand and raise arms to make a circle.)
I'm up like the sun at noon. (Stay in position.)
I set like the sun at nighttime, (Slowly sit down while keeping arms raised.)
And I sleep by the light of the moon. (Pillow hands under cheek and lie down.)




