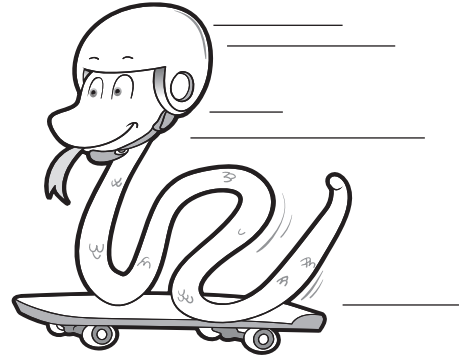





Answers for 1–3, 8, and 9 will vary.

4. Answers should include that the sentence refers to the family going to Mexico.
5. “Can Be a Food or Drink”: *jam, punch, shake, squash*
“Can’t Be a Food or Drink”: *match, park, stamp, trunk*
6. Possible answers include the following: *bat*—a flying mammal; *pitcher*—a jug with one handle; *ball*—a formal dance; *home*—the place where a person lives; *strike*—to stop working or to start a fire; *out*—at the end or away from a place.
7. unscrambled words: *sink, feet, park, fall, fire*
